L o v e (revisited)

You recall a couple of months ago, I talked about what the following words from Deuteronomy 6:5 meant to me: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength."

I wanted to continue our dialogue of this verse by sharing with you more insight on the word "LOVE". I researched passages all month long that focused on "LOVE". I found different ways to interpret this word, depending on how it was used in the passage. BORDER SERVANT CORPS

Border Servant Corps seeks to provide an opportunity for volunteers to work for justice, serve their neighbor, and walk humbly with their God.

Border Servant Corps hosts <u>full-time volunteers</u> live in the international community, learn about living simply, work for social justice, and explore spiritually. Volunteers work with issues such as poverty, immigration, domestic violence, education, and health care with opportunities to work in churches, shelters, legal centers, after-school programs, clinics, and other social service agencies within the unique context of the border region.

The Lutheran Border Awareness Project, funded by the Thrivent Foundation, encourages servant leadership through programs such as <u>Border Immersions</u>. Border Servant Corps hosts groups interested in first-

Hand cultural immersions focused on education of border issues. This program is designed for undergraduate missions, alternative spring break programs, seminarians, and church and youth groups. The Fellowship through Service program involves people from local organizations and congregations who are equipped to serve through a variety of programs. The Servant Stomp runs in conjunction with this program as a means of providing the opportunity with for community members to view and learn about local organizations where they can serve. Lastly is the Lutheran Leadership program where leaders from the church are encouraged to become more aware and involved in border issues through week-long immersions and additional education and service opportunities in the border region. with specific emphasis on faith, service and social justice.
